Arriving By Car - From Bradford/Leeds

Follow A650. Turn left at A650/Bingley Road. Continue to follow A650. Go through 1 roundabout. At the roundabout, take the 2nd exit and stay on A650. Go through 2 roundabouts. At the roundabout take the 1st exit onto A6035/Bradford Road. Take the 4th turning left into The Keighley Training Centre, Universal Mills.

Arriving By Car - From Skipton

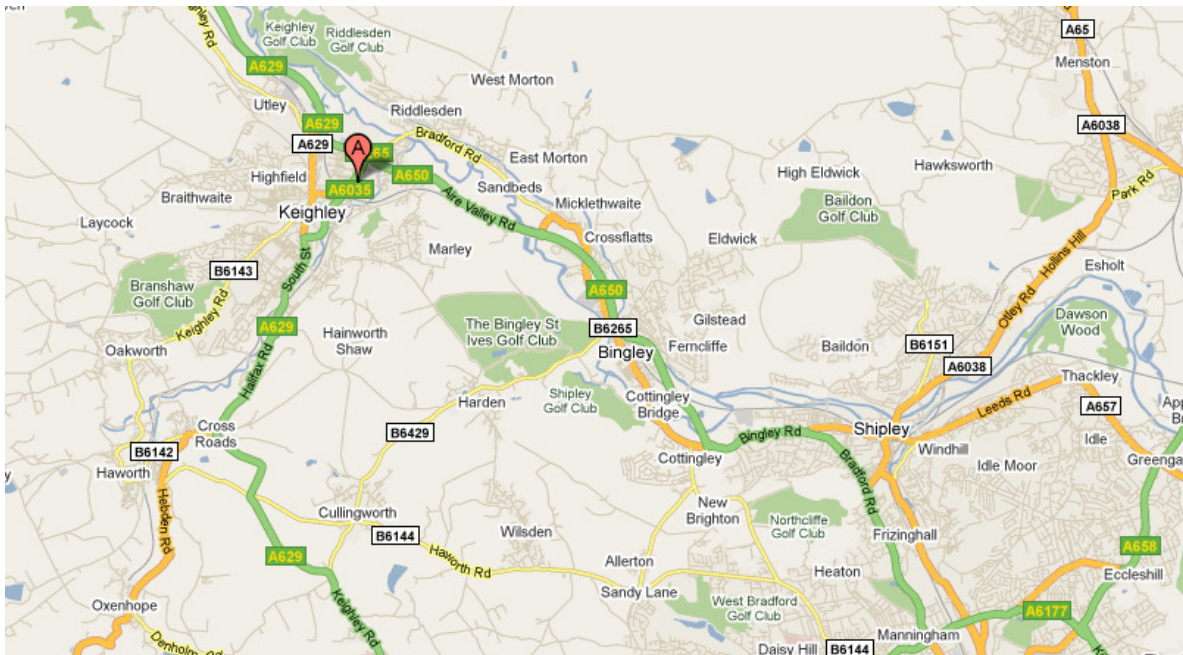
Head southwest toward Brougham Street. Continue straight onto A6069/Newmarket Street. At Caroline Square take the 1st exit onto A6131/Swadford Street. Turn left at A6131/Keighley Road. Go through 1 roundabout. At the roundabout take the 1st exit onto A629/Keighley Road. Continue to follow A629. Go through 2 roundabouts. At the roundabout, take the 1st exit onto A650/Hard Ings Road. At the roundabout take the 4th exit onto A6035/Bradford Road. Take the 4th turning left into The Keighley Training Centre, Universal Mills.

Arriving By Train

Turn right outside the Train Station, walking for approximately 3 minutes. The Keighley Training Centre is the 2nd turning on the right (first turning right after the Fire Station and before Towler & Staines).

Arriving By Bus

Exit Keighley Bus Station following the 'To Cavendish Street and Trains' sign. Turn right into Cavendish Street. At the bottom of Cavendish Street turn left onto Bradford Road. Cross the road at the first pelican crossing. Pass the Railway Station on your right, walking for approximately 3 minutes. The Keighley Training Centre is the 2nd turning on the right (first right after the Fire Station and before Towler & Staines)
